Every year, cases of Koi Herpesvirus Disease (KHVd) are reported on local club lakes and commercial fisheries. Once a fishery has it, it is extremely hard to get rid of, EVER, so flare-ups and fish deaths will keep happening.

The disease is spread to other venues if nets, mats, slings, waders, wellies, water buckets, baiting spoons and any other equipment that has come into contact with the infected water isn't properly CLEANED AND DRIED between fishing trips. UV rays from the sun are the only 100% failsafe way of getting rid of the virus - so YOU MUST CLEAN AND DRY ALL YOUR GEAR between fishing trips.

### **Rule Reminders**

Read the rule book, in particular the water specific rules.

- Spin all the numbers on padlocks!!!!!
- 2 rod max unless stated otherwise.
- Absolutely **NO barbeques** including disposable ones
- Park only in designated car parks.
- Report any incidents, trespassing or suspicious activity immediately by phone to a bailiff
- If you catch a Catfish at Burnt Wood, put in keepnet provided and report to Mark Lindsell on 07973 383952 immediately.
- Do not drop litter. This includes line, hooklinks, milk bottle seals, tea bags, wrappers etc. Take it home with you!
- Don't throw your cigarette butts on the floor either, put them in a bag or tin and take them home with you. Bailiffs will be checking smokers swims.

## **Moat Farm Reservoir at Collier Street**

Please be aware that we cancelled our agreement with this venue due to the farmer draining alot of the water during the summer and then wrecking the access track during the winter. So please do not go here as it is no longer one of our waters.



#### **Toilets**

No this isn't Dr Who dropping in, we have portaloos at Runham, Lydd, Brookland, Pattenden Lane and Burnt Wood from 1<sup>st</sup> April to November. Make sure you make use of them. If you find there is a problem with them, report it to a bailiff so we can sort it out. We may be putting padlocks on them with our usual code to stop non-members abusing them.

You can take them if they are not going to fish, but you will be responsible for them if you do. This means noise levels kept to a minimum, their safety, litter and the security of the venue.
