Quick Bites

Please be aware that we have given the details of all our waters to the Environment Agency for them to include in their patrols where possible. Please note there is a closed season on the River Medway, White Kemp Sewer and all parts of RFA waters you can fish with your membership It has been reported to the committee that some members are using rather colourful language at the top of their voice around the club waters, this is a family club we ask that you be mindful of this.

Permission will be given on the understanding that the club member will be responsible for any damage, injury or trespass that may occur. Guest Ticket Fees are: £20 for 24hrs






Burnt Wood

This is an update to members on the regeneration project at our Burnt Wood venue. As mentioned in the Winter Newsletter, the Committee are committed to invest in the water to ensure the fishing is improved for our membership.

Following the update, we sought advice from various specialists and carried out a Bathymetric Silt Survey to determine how much silt might need to be removed. Fortunately, and surprisingly, the amount of silt was not as much as first thought, and this means we will not be carrying out any dredging. Here is the silt survey:



Our previous chalking appears to be working but we have, in the past, focussed on the margins and so we will now continue with chalking on a regular basis and focus on the middle areas. It will take a lot of applications to improve the depths in these areas, but it is the most cost-effective way.

Dredging the middle areas is both impractical and given the volume also costly. We just need to win the battle of ensuring more chalk goes in and less leaves. Since the <u>Winter Newsletter</u>, we have coppiced the right-hand bank and we will look to do the same on the left-hand bank and at the far end this coming winter. It is too late to do this now as it is Summer. This will also give us time to tidy up the areas recently done as part of our work parties.

We are also looking at improving the Solar installation and when this is completed will look to run the three aeration stones longer. Previously we ran these at night/early morning when the dissolved oxygen was at its lowest. By clearing the trees, we will also improve wind movement – on its own one of the most effective providers of oxygen.

We will then also apply chalk in the Autumn – around 2 tonnes. Tree clearance will improve marginal plant levels such as lilies and irises etc. We will look to install some oxygenating plants when the time is right.

Whilst we cannot be sure, we believe that around 10 carp were lost in the Winter oxygen crash but as we only found six dead fish, we cannot be certain. We will look to refresh the fish stocks as and when we are certain the water quality is right.

Dave Sherwood, Club Secretary, has been doing a lot of the work down there himself in terms of burning tree debris, tidying up and weekly water quality checks etc so big thanks go to him. We would like to also thank Andy Wade for his work at the water as he has been spending a lot of time there doing swim maintenance, moving logs etc. as well.
